While traveling in Kenya in April, I was struck by the number of women I encountered who shared the joyful news that they could now afford to send their children to school with the proceeds of their small business. In an American experience, where access to some form of education is a right, I hadn't fully realized how hard families work for their children to have an education and the possibility of a bright and hopeful future.

This emphasis on the future also struck me as I traveled among Quakers this summer. Almost every community I visited was grappling with questions like "How do we encourage and welcome young people? What does the future of our community look like?" As a Quaker under forty, I often feel like I should have an answer to this question — but I don't. I do, however, have a lot of hope for a bright future.




Financial Summary Fiscal Year 2023

2023 Highlights

RSWR launched a new program to partner with women in Guatemala. Groups are currently forming in small villages surrounding the cities of Esquipulas and Chiquimula, in the Department (State) of Chiquimula, Guatemala. These groups will receive training and capacity building resources prior to submitting an application for grant funding in the spring of 2024.
