Building Partnerships

Recently Right Sharing visited with Quaker Pennswood Village residents in Newtown, PA who banded together to fund a women's group in Kenya. The residents received a report on the Andingo Support Group and an article was written about the visit by Norval Reece:

Will Reid, an active member of the Pennswood Village Right Sharing group, said, "This is a terrific report. Through their own efforts and small financial loans, these women are dramatically improving their lives, and those of their families, while simultaneously building sustainable, mutually beneficial relationships with others in their surrounding community. I believe micro-loans are the strongest instruments we have to ...help achieve a more just world."

For the RSWR project, the women took up six different businesses: fish mongering (since they are close to Lake Victoria), buying and selling cereal grain s, secondhand clothes and shoes, vegetable and fruit stalls, milk vending, and grocery kiosks selling essential goods like sugar, salt, soap, flour, and cooking oil. After six months, they report that the project is going well. Almost all of the women have been able to repay their first loans and have now taken second loans.

Serfina Akinyi is a widow with 6 people to take care of. She sells omena, which are small, dried fish that are in great demand, as they are a cheap source of protein. Before the RSWR fund arrived, she had a stock of Ksh.2,000 (\$14), but after funding, her stock is now worth Ksh.18,500 (\$132). She says, "I thank RSWR for considering us for these funds. It has helped me increase my stock, and hence increase my sales. I can now guarantee that my family has something on the table on a daily basis, and also, I am paying school fees for my children."

The Pennswood Village Quaker group must think the micro-lending projects of Right Sharing of world Resources have "a big impact for each dollar invested," because shortly after receiving the six-month report of their funded group in Kenya, they responded with enthusiasm and promptly agreed to raise an additional \$6,500 to fund a new RSWR group in India, Kenya, Sierra Leone or Guatemala.
